



On 21 June 2025, the city centre of Dudelange will once again be transformed into a musical hotspot: over 50 national and international acts will take to 13 stages and venues, bringing a wide variety of sounds to the city – from pop, rock, and electronic to rap, blues, and chanson.

At the **32nd edition** of the **Fête de la Musique in Dudelange**, there's something for every musical taste. To ensure an unforgettable experience for the tens of thousands of visitors, the City of Dudelange is once again working closely with the local cultural, community, and hospitality scenes.

A total of **eight open-air stages** and **three** additional **indoor** venues will transform the city **from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m.** into a vibrant melting pot of music.

Longstanding and newer collaborations will also continue and grow in 2025. The **École Régionale de Musique** will once again have a strong presence on both the Why Not Stage and the Parc Stage. The inclusive ensemble **Polyphonix** is also back this year, bringing together music, people, and pure joy with their energetic live performance.

As is tradition, the Fête de la Musique in Dudelange kicks off the evening before, on **Friday**, with a special musical prelude by the **organ students** of the regional music school at **St. Martin Church**.

Short artist bios *Main & Planet Stage*

Maxïmo Park The British indie rock band from Newcastle has been thrilling audiences since the early 2000s with energetic live shows and catchy anthems like *Apply Some Pressure* and *Books from Boxes*. Their lyrics are poetic, political, and always danceable – a guaranteed recipe for festival vibes.

Cali The passionate chansonnier with a big heart: Cali (Bruno Caliciuri) blends French rock, chanson, and raw emotion. For over 20 years, he has captivated audiences with deeply personal lyrics, strong convictions, and an electrifying stage presence.

Schëppe Siwen This Luxembourgish brass band mixes traditional wind music with funk, rock, Balkan beats, and a generous dose of humor. Their high-energy performances are full of surprises – true party starters made in Luxembourg.

Maale Gars is on a quest to explore the full creative potential of the Luxembourgish music scene. Since January 2020, Thomas Roland has been regularly releasing new tracks that hit the zeitgeist somewhere between melancholic electro-pop and powerful trap.

rosmarin is a young German indie-funk band formed in the summer of 2022. Their sound combines dreamy indie with driving funk grooves and bass-heavy techno elements – an exciting blend with its own signature.

Celtica With spectacular performances and an explosive fusion of bagpipes, rock, and metal, Celtica has captivated audiences worldwide. The band reinvents Celtic rhythms in an energetic new form – think Scotland meets heavy metal!

Maël & Jonas are a German pop duo from Koblenz who rose to fame in 2020 through their participation in *The Voice of Germany*. Musically, they navigate between indie pop, pop rock, and singer-songwriter styles with heartfelt lyrics and catchy melodies.

Alfalfa is a music project founded in 2018 by Bert Jung and Charel Geimer. This new collective symbolizes their artistic growth and their aim to present original sound productions both in Luxembourg and abroad.

Laurent Unchained describes his genre as *French Vogue Punk*. In his musical world, the raw passion of punk meets the elegance of French chanson. His powerful compositions are rich in emotion and authenticity.

marcy Her style blends the sweetness of marzipan with the eerie chill of deep woods. Alternative pop singer marcy sets out to make sense of the world around her through catchy melodies and bold sonic landscapes.
